The objective of this CME was to provide a platform to discuss various legal issues that arise in routine clinical practice keeping the background in mind that routinely, medical practitioners who are expert in their respective speciality are not much updated about legal aspect of clinical practice, hence, lack of this awareness leads to false allegations and litigations against the medical practitioners.

There were **770+ registrations** from various states of the countries as well as overseas (More than **6 countries**) (i.e., India, Iraq, Malaysia, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Sudan, etc.) encompassing delegates from almost all branches of medicine and allied, surgery (and allied) and super-specialities. The CME was conducted on virtual (ECHO) platform.
