## The Expanded Programme on Immunization (EPI):


- Launched by the WHO in 1974.
- Built on Smallpox infrastructure
- Initially, Targeted **6** childhood vaccine-preventable diseases:
  - diphtheria,
  - o pertussis,
  - tetanus,
  - o polio,
  - measles,
  - tuberculosis.



## **Immunization Program in India:**

- EPI launched in India-1978.
- Became Universal Immunization
   Programme(UIP) -1985.
- One of the largest public health initiatives, catering to nearly 26.7 million newborns and 29 million pregnant women annually.
- Nationally, the program targets **12 diseases**:
  - Diphtheria, Pertussis, Tetanus, Polio, Measles, Rubella, severe forms of Childhood Tuberculosis, Rotavirus diarrhea, Hepatitis B, and Meningitis & Pneumonia caused by Haemophilus Influenzae type B, Pneumococcal Pneumonia and Japanese Encephalitis.

 As part of future expansion plans, the center aims to include adult vaccination services.


